

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
I am requesting funding for the Potato Breeding and Cultivation Research project in the FY10 Agriculture Appropriations bill. The amount requested for this project is \$1,050,000. The entity to receive funding for this project is Washington State University, located at the French Administration Building, Room 324, Pullman, WA 99164.

Over a period of fourteen years, the Northwest Tri-State potato breeding and cultivation research project has yielded cultural management recommendations and new knowledge on potato varieties. This knowledge has led to the decrease in the use of harmful pesticides and increased profitability in the potato industry. In fact, a recent economic analysis revealed that every dollar invested in the program results in a \$39 return.

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
I am requesting funding for the STEEP IV project in the FY10 Agriculture Appropriations bill. The amount requested for this project is \$444,000. The entity to receive funding for this project is Washington State University, located at the French Administration Building, Room 324, Pullman, WA 99164.

This research will contribute solutions to modern societal problems faced by U.S. farmers and the public, such as energy and food security, sequestration of greenhouse gasses, and improved trade balance. Conservation information obtained through this work is transferable to other parts of the U.S. and the world. Benefits of this research include reduction in food production costs and greater energy independence for the nation's food supply.

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
I am requesting funding for the Development and Feasibility of Perennial Wheat for Highly Erodible Lands project in the FY10 Agriculture Appropriations bill. The amount requested for this project is \$100,000. The entity to receive funding for this project is Washington State University, located at the French Administration Building, Room 324, Pullman, WA 99164.

Perennial wheat offers a viable option for sustainable farming systems and improved environmental stewardship. Soil erosion by wind and water is a direct cause of lower air and water quality; perennial wheat provides constant soil coverage by plant material, resistance to pests and diseases, and as a source of straw for new fiber products. The overall goal of this research is to develop perennial wheat into a viable part of small grains cropping systems, especially in areas where soil erosion potential is high.

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
I am requesting funding for the Protecting the Pacific Northwest Grape Industry From Plant Viruses project in the FY10 Agriculture Appropriations bill. The amount requested for this project is \$233,000. The entity to receive funding for this project is Washington State University, located at the French Administration Building, Room 324, Pullman, WA 99164.

To maintain competitiveness and health, this project addresses an immediate high-priority need to meet the certification standards of the vineyard industry.

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
I am requesting funding for the Odessa Subarea Special Study project in the FY10 Energy and Water Appropriations bill. The amount requested for this project is \$1,000,000. The entity to receive funding for this project is Columbia Basin Development League, located at 8582 Road K SW, Royal City, WA 99357.

The Federal Reclamation Columbia Basin Project has been the underlying driver for the economy in Central Washington. Investment in the expansion of Project infrastructure to allow delivery of Project water to eligible lands will avoid ecological disaster by preserving the remaining groundwater supplies for other uses, maintain the existing production base, preserve jobs, and provide long-term stability.

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
I am requesting funding for the General Investigations, Walla Walla Watershed project in the FY10 Energy and Water Appropriations bill. The amount requested for this project is \$500,000. The entity to receive funding for this project is Confederated Tribes of Umatilla Indian Reservation, located at 73239 Confederated Way, Pendleton, Oregon 97801.

The Army Corps, in conjunction with the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla, is focusing on the restoration and management of a viable ecosystem within the Walla Walla River Basin. The project is a high-priority for the local communities and the agricultural sector because instream flows enable the start of salmon reintroduction and a strong agricultural economy.

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
I am requesting funding for the Grass Seed Cropping Systems for Sustainable Agriculture Project in the FY10 Agriculture Appropriations bill. The amount requested for this project is \$471,000. The entity to receive funding for this project is Washington State University, located at the French Administration Building, Room 324, Pullman, WA 99164.

Over 90% of the U.S. cool season forage and turfgrass is produced in the Pacific Northwest. The grass seed industry is facing some critical environmental and economic challenges including: public pressure to phase out open-field burning; alleviation of smoke, dust, and chemical trespass from crop production areas; lack of integrated cropping systems; and development of maximum genetic and biological potential. These high-priority needs are being addressed, utilizing the research and technology expertise of scientists from Washington, Oregon, Idaho, and USDA-ARS with input from industry representatives. Industry and state funds have also been directed toward this project. By researching the genetic of barley, the United States can further the goal of establishing and maintaining a robust and healthy agriculture industry and address the national and regional agricultural research needs.

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
I am requesting funding for the Cool Season Food Legumes project in the FY10 Agriculture Appropriations bill. The amount requested for this project is \$235,000. The entity to receive funding for this project is Washington State University, located at the French Administration Building, Room 324, Pullman, WA 99164.

Since 1991, the Cool Season Food and Legume research program has worked to improve the efficiency and sustainability of the U.S. dry pea, fresh pea, lentil, and chickpea industries. The program is a cooperative effort between federal and state university scientists to establish and maintain a robust and healthy agriculture industry and address national and regional agricultural research needs as they relate to the development of genetically-superior legume varieties.



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

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
I am requesting funding for the Cereal Rust Disease Initiative project in the FY10 Agriculture Appropriations bill. The amount requested for this project is \$3,500,000. The entity to receive funding for this project is USDA Agricultural Research Service located at the Jamie L. Whitten Building; 1400 Independence Avenue, S.W.; Washington, D.C.; 20250.

Highly virulent and aggressive new races of stem, leaf, and stripe rust have appeared in the world, which now threaten the entire U.S. production of wheat, barley, and oats. An aggressive, coordinated research effort is needed to identify and introduce new germplasm, genes, and varieties with improved and sustainable rust resistance. If stem rust races become established in the U.S., wheat production losses of over 1.4 billion bushels per year, worth approximately \$10 billion, are possible.
